Welcome

Welcome to the first edition of Durham Region Hospice News. For the past year and a half there has been a lot of work done to bring residential hospices to Clarington and Whitby. With a dedicated and passionate group of volunteers in both communities Durham Region Hospice (DRH) has been able to build awareness of the need for these facilities and to make a significant start on the fundraising required to make them happen. This update will provide an overview of what we've done, where we are and what more needs to happen.

Thank You

First of all, a huge thank you to everyone. Thank you to our volunteers who continue to drive this project forward by serving on the Boards of Directors, by willingly doing presentations and speaking engagements throughout our communities, by spreading the word on the need for residential hospice through sharing their stories, and by organizing events in the community including bake sales, paint nights, golf tournaments, special dinners and more.

Thank you to our donors, in particular the individuals, community groups, companies, associations, foundations, service clubs, church groups and others who were among the first to give to this great cause when it was just a dream. Your faith in the project and the people making it happen is commendable. Each donation whether it's small or large makes a difference.

Finally, thanks to all of you for your patience as we've got this project to where we are today. We know many of you have been looking for an update and we are grateful for the opportunity to now share that with you.

Project Update

Planning for the two builds (10 beds in Whitby and 5 beds in Clarington) is well underway. We have beautiful sites (generously donated by the two municipalities), architectural drawings, Ministry approval, and preliminary operational plans. Our site plans are in the final phase of municipal approval. We are looking forward with much excitement to a ground breaking later this fall or early in the spring. We will keep you informed, as we want you to share in the magical moment when we begin to see all of our dreams become reality.

Funding Update

The capital campaign to build the two residential hospices totals approximately \$15,000,000. Of that amount the Province of Ontario will provide \$3,000,000 leaving us to raise \$12,000,000 in the community. We need to raise \$9,000,000 in order to break ground.

As of the middle of September, 2019 we have raised or have received commitments for approximately \$5,600,000. This is a very good start in less than a year and a half. Wow and thank you again. However, it also means we need another \$3,400,000 in order to break ground and start construction. Together we can make it happen.

Phase 2 of our fundraising efforts will be for \$3,000,000. This required for the first two years of operating as well as for furnishing the buildings.

If you need to connect with the fundraising team it consists of three part-time staff.
